HOW DID YOU FIRST LEARN ABOUT FIRST BOOK?

During my first semester as a librarian in my current school district, I received a plethora of amazing books for free through a First Book grant that the previous librarian had been awarded. I thought, "What is this greatness? How can I get more books for students at my two Title I schools?" Over the past 11 years, we have received funding from various corporations such as the Ford Foundation, Pizza Hut, and Whataburger.

WHAT ABOUT FIRST BOOK'S MISSION SPEAKS TO YOU?

Equal access to quality education is a fundamental right. First Book has used that shared mission to grow powerful partnerships. I've seen firsthand how the power of book ownership has impacted families in our community. First Book has enabled our district bookmobile and local Little Free Libraries to stay stocked with quality books to share with kids in need. TO YOU, WHAT ARE THE MOST IMPORTANT ELEMENTS OF A GOOD BOOK?

Making connections and opening the reader to new worlds, people, and places outside of their everyday life through the power of story.

AS A SCHOOL LIBRARIAN, DO YOU HAVE A FAVORITE BOOK THAT YOU READ WITH YOUR STUDENTS?

My most recent favorite read-aloud is Malcolm Mitchell's <u>My Very Favorite Book in the Whole Wide World</u>. He used his own experiences to share a story that connects to numerous readers. Our students love this book because many of them can see themselves in the struggles of a reluctant reader. I share with my kids how the author's use of simile and descriptive language, makes reading his book a sensory experience that we can see, hear, feel, and even smell, drawing on our own memories via our senses.

This fall, I plan to read aloud LeUyen Pham's beautiful new picture book, <u>Inside</u>, <u>Outside</u>, as we begin a new year and reflect on our recent experiences when the world changed during the pandemic. Books connect us. Reading aloud provides a rich experience to explore and expand upon those connections.

IF YOU COULD SPEND THE DAY WITH A POPULAR AUTHOR, WHO WOULD YOU CHOOSE AND WHY?

Perhaps Patricia McLachlan or Peter Reynolds. Reading a beautifully written story like <u>Sarah</u>, <u>Plain and Tall</u> or <u>All the Places to Love</u> transports me into the lives and hearts of the characters. I really love historical fiction and she does it so well.

In the same way, Peter Reynolds' book, <u>The Word Collector</u> emphasizes the power of words. I'm impressed and inspired by his ongoing work to write and/or illustrate books that help us discover our place in the world and our relationships with the world and each other. His books are both timely and timeless. I would love the chance to watch him create his amazing works through his drawings and stories.

HOW DID READING IMPACT YOU AS A CHILD?

As the middle child of five, reading was my favorite escape. Books helped me experience worlds outside my own and gave me insight and empathy. My avid reading contributed to my success in school and inspired me to become a teacher and librarian. It set the stage for me to be a lifelong learner and lover of story.

WHAT WOULD YOU TELL SOMEONE WHO IS THINKING ABOUT SUPPORTING FIRST BOOK'S WORK?

In 2019, I partnered with other educators to write a grant when the OMG Book Awards became available in our state. Between that grant and ongoing donations from our community, we have given away 50,000+ free books. WHY DO YOU LOVE FIRST BOOK'S BOOK CLUB?

The book club helps me feel connected to the larger mission of First Book. It's an ongoing reminder to be open to ways I can have an impact in my own community through literacy projects.

Each month a simple white box shows up in my mailbox. When I see that the return address is First Book, I can't wait to discover the treasure inside! The staff at First Book select powerful reads and resources to accompany the books. One highlight is the letter enclosed in the box, detailing each book and its author and why they were selected for the book club.
