

## First Book's Impact and Innovation Platform

**Statement of Need.** As funders and policymakers at the national and state levels work to both stabilize and transform the childcare and public education sectors, it is critical to engage and harness the energy and knowledge of the extraordinary providers who are performing innovative and impactful work with underserved children daily. However, it is extremely difficult to manage a comprehensive system to identify, evaluate, and elevate these creative models so that best practices can be shared with the entire field.

The Solution: First Book's Impact and Innovation Platform. First Book has built a proven model that comprehensively manages competitive grant processes to identify, evaluate, and accelerate the most innovative ideas. **The Components of the Platform.** First Book's platform is a refined and proven process that has been used to evaluate and reward community innovators across the country. The process includes:

- A system for soliciting thousands of applications simultaneously;
- A powerful rubric for comprehensive evaluation;
- A rigorous, multi-phased evaluation process to select finalists and winners;
- A process to award winners and provide consolation funding;
- A critical impact evaluation process to ensure that goals are met; and
- The ability to share best practices nationwide through the First Book Network of educators and beyond.

**Record of Success.** First Book has employed this model to distribute cash grants as well as many types of needed educational resources – books, puzzles, manipulatives and beyond. Some examples include:

- 33-State Book Distribution. In 2019, First Book launched an initiative to distribute \$4.7 million in books to programs and schools to more than 1.5 million children through 80 organizations across 33 states. Through a competitive 'request for proposals' (RFP) process, First Book solicited over 500 applications detailing original and innovative programs for using books to unlock new opportunities for children in need. Most critically, through this massive effort, community champions raised local and national awareness of the need for and value of more equitable access to critical educational resources.
- COVID-19 Technology Distribution. In 2020, recognizing the tremendous impact COVID-19 had
  exacerbating the technology and educational inequities in communities in need, First Book, Intel
  Corporation, the LEGO Foundation, CDW-G and the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving
  partnered to provide much needed resources to innovative districts most in need of these



resources. First Book leveraged its platform to evaluate the needs and capacities of school districts across the country in order to distribute more than 17,000 laptops, 7,500 LEGO Education Solutions and more than \$200,000 in internet connectivity stipends to 52 school districts across 16 states to better support virtual learning.
