### **ILLINOIS IMPACT STORY**

In 2018, The Chicago Public Schools Department of Literacy and First Book launched an ongoing partnership to fill classrooms with culturally diverse books that will foster interest, motivation, and sustained engagement in independent reading. This infusion of contemporary, culturally relevant books ignited students' interest and motivation and enabled teachers to better implement the independent reading practices they have been honing through CPS's Balanced Literacy Initiative. To date, the partnership has provided culturally relevant infusion sets to 220 K-2 classroom libraries, text sets to support independent reading and book clubs in 3rd-5th grade classrooms in 50 schools, and book credits for 535 teachers, benefitting approximately 16,000 students.
