

All educators, caregivers, and providers working in a Title I eligible school, early childhood or out-of-school-time program, shelter, clinic, or other organization in which at least 70% of children served come from low-income families are eligible to join the First Book Community for free.

MICHIGAN IMPACT STORY

First Book worked closely with AFT Michigan to provided over 40,000 books to new educators across the state of Michigan and rural and Native American communities in the following cities and counties: Crawford AuSable, Fairview, Hale, Kingsley, Lake City, Les Cheneaux, Onaway, Rudyard, Tawas, and Whitefish. The books were used to create classroom collections and restock public libraries and community centers. First Book committees were created to hold book distribution events with students and families at schools to encourage parent engagement and build community. County Sheriff's and EMS Departments in smaller cities were also provided books to build better relationships between police/EMS and the students, families, and the community at large.
